Author's Note

I have a tendency to become what I read when reading it. Admittedly, Hitler has a peculiar effect on people, and were this not the case he likely would not have rose to the position he did in a time of social turmoil and utter economic collapse. For months after reading his manifesto I found myself looking for a jew behind everything I did not like, and the mind-fuck of it is that the more one looks for a thing the more they are likely to find it. At the time of writing this, and after two years of hoping for the development of some local navigation center, it was a Jew – a leader of the local art museum no less (Hitler links Jews to the deterioration of art, architecture, and culture in society) – who suddenly stepped in to try and stop it. Starbucks C.E.O. – a primary example of one who got rich off of commodifying social relations (see my more recent post 'Synopsis') suddenly decided to run for president. I found myself bitching about these things on Facebook then it suddenly hit me –Mark Zuckerberg is Jewish! I got to wondering why homelessness is one of the few issues rarely depicted in films, and when it is no one seems to ever bother to try to see the good sides of the life without property. It turns out Jews practically run Hollywood.

Then one day I decided to support Michael Bloomberg for president thinking it might make a good test to see if I am crazy or if these Jews are really trying for some kind of world domination or ruination. Then I found myself supporting his ideas around labor which were qualitative rather than quantitative (he believes the job market can be restored in some ways by the reduction in minimum wage). Almost overnight, the spell Hitler's words had put me in dissipated, and I was reminded that I actually like Jews. It was in fact my original intentions when I began this study to make a comparison [in principle not scale] between the development of the Holocaust and some aspects we are observing on the issue of homelessness.

Somewhere in between the somewhat insubstantial facts he throws out and all the incredibly clever and articulate deductions he makes along the way of linking these things to the Jews, without yourself becoming an history buff as he was, it becomes difficult to say what reality is. And that is perhaps the most appealing thing about Hitler; he understood reality – even what has already transpired (history) – is not in the facts but in the way they are constructed.

Obviously I was taken with some of the beneficial ideas Hitler championed – particularly his ideas on labor. However, I am not a Nazi as my ideologies differ from his in some fundamental ways;

- 1) I don't believe in racism; whereas Hitler intentionally stopped his reasoning at a certain point in evolution beyond which he thought speculation was pointless, my reasoning goes far beyond the last few thousand years and therefore transcends the Kurgan hypothesis and the concept of race in general to instead identify a pervasive addiction of the entire human species (privacy which eventually [somehow] evolved into private property). This in turn allows one to identify the massive buildings and advanced weaponry of Aryan cultures as a byproduct of a disease that is immune to ones skin color rather than some innately higher quality of some 'Aryan race'.
- 2) The Holocaust evolved as a result of over a decade of trying to tell one group of people that they did not have the right to be in some specific land, but this is essentially the opposite of everything I believe in it is not man's place to do this.
- 3) there is a profound difference between encouraging people to find a scapegoat for their problems (the Jews) and trying to get people to instead look in the mirror to begin addressing their own problems. If one can do so, it is equivalent to having people stand up straight, and if a Jew or some other group/entity falls down in the process then this tells you they were building their house on the backs of others, and now perhaps the two will see eye to eye. But this is very different than saying grab them by the ankles and throw them down and put a bullet in their heads.

History is not my primary area of study. This work resulted from me devoting some of my spare time in what was a year off for me from formal study [of physics]. Yet even in my time off physics [and work] still occupies most of my time. These essays of mine represent a 'point-in-time' accounting of my knowledge. For me they are as much a learning experience as they are a means to disseminate knowledge. I wish I had time to read more on the issue, particularly from authors who were not themselves members of the Nazi regime, so as to get a more balanced point of view, but if I must choose I will choose to read a man's own words before I read a third hand account, even if it runs the risk of acquiring a bias perspective.

As for Hitler's second 'secret' book *Zweites Buch*, I do not believe it was Hitler who wrote it. Something about his speech/ writing patterns made it such that I could hardly read a page of *Mein Kampf* without making a highlight – as though someone had a series of 'ahh-ha' moments and simply filled in the gaps to make a book. I read about five or ten pages of *Zweites Buch* and did not make a single highlight.

Finally, on the chance this essay challenged anyone's notions of fatherhood and monogamous love a note is in order. As for the former, from a son's perspective fatherhood between a man and his son is more like a bond of brotherhood; one of the last vestiges of kinship which thrives in domesticated society today, albeit in a strained and unnatural form. As for the latter, life is sufficiently complex I believe concepts such as 'true love' can exist in a monogamous, polyandrous, or a polygamous setting; there will always be individuals holding out (emotionally and/ or physically) in hopes of finding a more suitable mate than what currently presents itself just as there are exceptions to the idea of one male jealously hoarding *all* mating privileges. And of course, obviously humans are not Apes.
